- 3. How would you evaluate your own commitment to and engagement with this course?

- 1. How much do you think you've learned from this course?
 - I took Intro to Macro in my first semester of freshman year. This course has been very demanding and forced me to understand all the concepts that I had previously forgotten

- 3. How effective was the instructor in conducting the class sessions?
 - Professor Lin makes sure we are paying attention with "cold calls" which helps us learn the information
 - Very productive-didn't waste any time. Stellar notes that always prepared me for assignment and tests
 - I appreciated the class participation and felt he answers questions fully and efficiently
 - The most effective course that I have taken so far!
 - We used class time efficiently and were very productive this semester
 - Keep cold calling people, that helps everyone understand the material
 - Although I was skeptical at first, Professor Lin really grew on me. He is a great teacher who really cares about his students
 - More examples and quizzes that are closer to the structure of exam questions would be helpful, other then that clear lectures and the instructor was willing to stop and review any misunderstandings at any point during the class
 - Much was covered in class. First half of semester class felt rushed and I was confused. Second half went more smoothly
 - One can tell Lin always prepared for the class and knew the direction he wanted to take it
 - Although tough in the beginning, I always learned a lot during the lectures and good examples were used
 - Sometimes it could be a bit intimidating answering questions
 - Very efficient and clear
 - Professor Lin made sure we all understood the material very well in the way he conducted class
 - It is a very interactive course

 - The calling on students was intimidating at first but it made us all understand the material significantly better

- 4. How would you rate the assignments and tests the instructor required as measures of learning in the course?
 - Tests in this class are much harder than the assignments that were given to us over the semester. I feel like the tests do not accurately reflect my understanding of course material
 - Understood that tests aren't the only way of measuring success/understanding
 - I felt the tests were a good measurement, while the memos had some difficulties due to lack of clarity
 - He is so fair! Focus on our efforts not only the exam points
 - <u>Very</u> tough but sometimes a little unfair, however this was resolved
 - They were challenging but fair
 - Challenging exams but an excellent way to assess true understanding
 - Definitely very <u>few</u> trick questions
 - I actually would have liked more HW assignments
 - Exams are difficult and must fully understand concepts
 - Tests are too long for a 75 minute session
 - The graded assignments were very difficult
 - The tests are long and hard
 - Tests and memos were great but assignments were pretty tough
 - I thought they were very fair for the most part beside the second question on the second midterm

 - Professor Lin provides prompt comments and grades on tests and assignments and meets with us to make sure we know what we need to improve on
