From my understanding and experience at Gettysburg College, intro courses are supposed to get students interested in a major by presenting basic/limited info so they come back for more. Instead, our first test had 12 people below a 50, and subsequently, about half of our class ended up dropping. Some of these students who dropped had previously told me they hoped to major in econ, and will now have to find something else they are less interested in. It's also frustrating for students looking for an elective in a topic they feel is useful, and end up walking into a class that is not characteristic of an intro, dragging down GPAs
